### INTERNATIONAL VISITING FELLOWSHIP

#### **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

### I. Introduction

The Taiwan Foundation for Democracy (TFD) is the first democracy assistance foundation to be established in Asia, being devoted to strengthening democracy and human rights in Taiwan and abroad.

One of the TFD's core purposes is to promote research into global democratic and human rights development, in order to advance democracy-building theory and practice. In particular, the TFD seeks to connect with experienced democracy and human rights practitioners to support their research and help build international networks. Research into Taiwan's democratization experience can provide lessons for other democratizing countries, as well as identify areas where Taiwan still needs to improve. Therefore, comparative research with reference to other newly democratized countries will also be encouraged.



## II. Program Details

Every year, a select number of International Visiting Fellows may stay in Taiwan to complete an independent research project for up to one year. The TFD aims to have International Visiting Fellows establish contact and network with Taiwan's related nongovernmental organizations, to encourage the development of cooperative international projects, and to support research and writing of those working in the field of democracy assistance. As the International Visiting Fellowship is designed to provide foreign scholars and practitioners with the opportunity to study Taiwan's democracy and human rights, Taiwanese citizens are not eligible to apply. The International Visiting Fellowship includes a monthly stipend to assist with living expenses in Taiwan. The TFD will also reimburse those International Visiting Fellows who are outside of Taiwan at the time their fellowship begins for the cost of a round-trip plane ticket to Taipei.

Another important goal of the TFD is to encourage the building of relationships between organizations, institutions, and individuals working for democracy and human rights issues worldwide. The TFD believes that through an active exchange of ideas and expertise between academics and practitioners, NGOs and academic institutes, democracy and human rights can be strongly promoted not only in Taiwan but internationally as well.

International Visiting Fellows may contribute to TFD initiatives and projects as well. They will be provided with shared office space (including internet access) at the TFD's office in Taipei. By the end of their fellowships, International Visiting Fellows should make at least one large, public presentation. International Visiting Fellows will be encouraged to participate in a wide range of conferences, seminars, and other events throughout Taiwan.

## **International Visiting Fellowship Application Checklist**

Submitting an application

- □ Contact your two referees as early as possible
- □ Submit a complete application, including:
  - A completed application form, including the following sections:
    - □ Contact information
    - □ Project plan
  - □ A copy of your curriculum vitae

Upon receiving notification of acceptance

- □ The TFD will mail two copies of your official acceptance letter to the address provided on your application. Sign both copies and mail one copy back to the TFD, keeping the other copy for your records
- □ Arrange your accommodation in Taiwan
- □ If necessary, arrange for your Taiwan visa
- □ Purchase your ticket to Taiwan
- □ Send the following to the TFD as soon as they are available:
  - □ Flight itinerary
  - □ Bank information
  - □ Contact information in Taiwan
- □ Arrange to visit the TFD shortly after you arrive in Taiwan

Upon arriving in Taiwan

- □ Visit the TFD at the time arranged. Please bring the following:
  - □ Passport
  - □ Airfare invoice
  - □ Flight itinerary
  - □ Ticket or printout of e-ticket
  - □ Boarding pass for flight to Taiwan
- □ Pick up your business cards from the TFD
- □ Arrange for a workspace at the TFD, if required
