Essential Documents ☐ 1.Passport Application Form: (1) Complete sections 1-11 using the same information from your old passport; (2) Mark "N/A" if info is unavailable; (3) Contact information is mandatory; (4) Sign section 11 on the back.
 2.Two Photos: Taken within the last 6 months; white background, head size of 3.2 to 3.6cm, showing full outline of ears, closed mouth, eyeglasses not recommended. 3.Current Passport (Original and copy):(1) Required even if expired; (2) Applications without the above will be
treated as lost/replacement passport applications, requiring completion of item 12 below. 4.Proof of U.S. Status (Copy): Any one of: U.S. Passport / Green Card / Certificate of Citizenship / Visa / Driver's License.
 5.Fee Payment:*Standard (10 years) \$45; *Applicants Under 14 (5 years): \$31; Cash, cashier's check, or money order only. Pay *Military-Eligible Males (student status): \$31; to "TECO". No personal checks/credit cards. *Emergency Non-Chip Passport (1 year): \$10 (Not applicable for visa-free entry to other countries).
6.Return Mail (if not picking up in person): USPS return envelope only. Flat Rate Priority envelope with \$11.90 in physical stamps, or Flat Rate Priority Express envelope with \$33.40 in physical stamps. Address the envelope to yourself as the recipient. Keep your tracking number. *QR code stamps are only valid for a few days. Avoid using them.

□ 7.Missing or outdated birthplace/ID number on your passport: □ (copy) Taiwan ID, Household Registration Transcript(戶謄), Household Registry(戶□名簿), or birth certificate document. ※If the passport birthplace is "China," update it to the relevant city /province. If the birthplace is "Taiwan" and you were born in Taipei, New Taipei, Taoyuan, Taichung, Tainan, or Kaohsiung, update it to the city name. If no birthplace is listed, or if you have difficulty providing it, complete the □ Birthplace Declaration Form. □7.1 Exception: If your city of birth is now a municipality and you haven't updated your Taiwan ID or household registration, use the birthplace on your old passport. No ID or registration is needed. 7.2 Note: If your passport does not have an ID number or has a number that is not 10 digits long, also complete the □ Application for Assignment of National ID Number. Important: If your name contains variant characters, use the official household registration data (e.g., 黃/黃, 高/高, 峰/峯). Otherwise, consult the household registration office for name changes. □ 7.3 If your passport bears your mother's name and your name, but does not contain your birthplace, please provide a birth certificate document with your birthplace listed.
■ 8.Nationals Without Taiwan Household Registration Visiting Taiwan on a Taiwan Passport: ∶ It is mandatory to complete the Declaration Form for Entry Permit for Unregistered Nationals. If returning for over 3 months, also complete ■ ROC Entry/Exit Application Form and attach ■ 1 passport photo.
9.Passport Endorsement or Amendment: For changing foreign name, adding a foreign alias, or changing a foreign alias, complete Application for Passport Endorsement/Amendment. Provide both originals and copies of all supporting documents (originals will be returned after verification; notarized copies or originals are acceptable for mail-in applications).
10.Applicants Under 18 (unless married): Both parents or legal guardians, or the sole legal guardian, must sign Section 11. Submit ☐ (copy) proof of parent-child relationship (e.g., birth certificate/household registration transcript) or guardianship documents, and ☐ a copy of both parents'/guardians' ROC passports (or foreign passports if they are foreign nationals). Note: For the applicant's signature in section 11, if the child is 7 or under and unable to sign, a parent can sign on their behalf, adding "Father, on child's behalf" or "Mother, on child's behalf" after the child's name.
□ 11.Male Nationals of Military Age (19-36 years old):(1) Valid ROC Passport with "Overseas Compatriot Identity Endorsement": Submit □ Application for Overseas Status Endorsement/Transfer and □ original and copy of valid overseas residence ID (originals will be returned; notarized copies are acceptable for mail-in applications). The new passport will be stamped directly. (2) First-Time Application for "Overseas Compatriot Identity Endorsement": Submit □ original valid passports from all countries (including expired/un-renewed ones); □ Application for Overseas Compatriot Identity Endorsement/Transfer; □ Application for Certificate of Entry/Exit Dates (\$4/copy). Complete a form for each passport held (including ROC passport, even expired ones). (3) Male Students Abroad: Submit □ original proof of enrollment, authenticated by the ROC overseas mission (originals will be returned; notarized copies acceptable for mail-in). (4) Exempted, Deferred, or Completed Military Service: Submit □ "Exemption/Deferment Certificate" or □ Certificate of Completion of Service
