

Representative Eric Huang, who has a diplomatic career of more than 20 years, served three tours respectively in the United States of America, Singapore and Canada before coming to the Baltic countries as the head of the Taipei Mission to the Republic of Latvia.

From 2018 to 2020, Representative Huang was the Director-General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Chicago,

responsible for promoting relations between the R.O.C.(Taiwan) and seven U.S. Midwest states. During this period, on behalf of the Transportation Ministry of Taiwan, he signed four agreements on the mutual recognition of driver's license between Taiwan and the states of Wisconsin, Minnesota, Indiana, and Ohio.

From 2016 to 2018, Representative Huang was the Deputy Director-General for the Department of International Cooperation and Economic Affairs of Taiwan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA), which oversees Taiwan's international aid and cooperation programs and Taiwan's participation in the World Trade Organization.

During his service in Singapore from 2012 to 2015, he was in charge of political affairs in Taiwan's representation in Singapore and was also tasked with issues pertaining to the negotiations of the ASTEP agreement, the free trade agreement between Taiwan and Singapore. He also closely monitored the development of issues on the South China Sea and relevant international laws during that period.

Before his tenure in Singapore, Representative Huang worked in the National Security Council for Taiwan's President as an assistant to a Deputy Secretary-General on areas of Taiwan's national economic security and trade policy. He was involved in the launch of negotiation of the free trade agreement between Taiwan and New Zealand (ANZTEC) and the inter-agency collaboration for the negotiation of the free trade agreement between Taiwan and Singapore (ASTEP).

He also served in various departments of MOFA, including the Department of North American Affairs, the Bureau of Consular Affairs (BOCA), and the Department of Human Resources. When he was with BOCA, he was in charge of

the management of the global IT infrastructure for Taiwan's passport, visa and notarial services at home and abroad.

Representative Huang has an MBA from the University of Chicago. He was also assigned by MOFA to attend training programs at Harvard University and at Oxford University at different times. He graduated from National Taiwan University with a Bachelor's degree in international business and attended part of the Master's program. Born in 1973, Eric Huang is married and the father of two teenagers.
